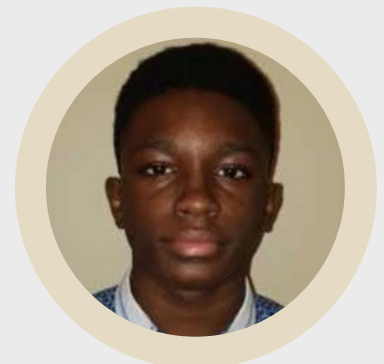
### MONIFE OYEDE | OUTSTANDING MEMBER OF THE YEAR
